New Tardy Policy- Effective January 7, 2020

Unexcused Tardy Policy (Grades 7-12)

Students will suffer no consequences on the <u>first tardy or second tardy</u>. The <u>third tardy</u> will result in a parent conference with a school administrator. The student will be assigned to morning detention on the <u>fourth tardy</u>. The <u>fifth tardy</u> will result in ISS (In School Suspension). Students who have acquired <u>six tardies</u> will be assigned to Alternative School for a minimum of five days. Student drivers with <u>more than six</u> <u>tardies</u> will have driving privileges on school campus suspended for a period of time.

Morning Detention (4 tardies)

Morning detention will begin at 7:00am. Parents/guardians must provide transportation to early morning detention. No bus service will be provided. A notification letter will be sent home when a student is assigned early morning detention. Morning detention will be administered at least twice monthly. If a student is absent or tardy to morning detention, he/she will be placed at Alternative School for a minimum of three days.

In-School Suspension (5 tardies)

ISS begins after homeroom and concludes at the end of the school day. Students complete classwork in an alternate setting with supervision provided by school faculty and staff.

Alternative School (6 tardies)

The Blount County Allgood Alternative Program is housed at 45 Community Road, Oneonta. The Blount County Alternative Program is governed under Board Policy 5.23 on Page 40 of the *Student Code of Conduct*.

Driving Privileges Suspended (Greater than 6 tardies)

For every tardy greater than a total of 6, student drivers will have driving privileges on school campus suspended for a minimum of two weeks.
